The mission of the Illinois School for the Deaf is to educate students who are deaf or hard of hearing to be responsible, self-supporting citizens.

Communication Philosophy

Illinois School for the Deaf (ISD) is an accessible ASL/English bilingual community in which people who are deaf, hard of hearing, and hearing learn and work together without language and communication barriers.





Policy Regarding Use of Amplification

In assuring access to information, it is appropriate that accommodations be made for the reception of auditory information to meet individual needs. This includes supporting the use of amplification devices, such as cochlear implants (Cls), and providing encouragement for listening and learning through audition as appropriate.

Services and Therapy

A wide range of educational and support services are available to students with Cls such as:


- Speech and language services based on each student's IEP
 - Goals can focus on: auditory train ing, articulation and speech/language therapy, speechreading practice, signed and spoken language, literacy skills and use of assistive technology
- Opportunities for audition only and spoken language in informal and formal settings in accordance with the ISD Communication Philosophy
- Assessment, counseling and habilitation conducted by numerous specialists including psychologists, social workers, audiologist, and educators
- Peer support groups, facilitated by a staff person, to discuss cochlear implant issues
- Basic troubleshooting services and coordination for repair provided by the audiologist on staff
- Ongoing collaboration with cochlear implant centers to support therapy and device use

Speech and language services are provided individually or in groups by state-licensed, ASHA certified speech-language pathologists.

Deaf adults, including some who have Cls, are also present in a variety of capacities on campus to serve as role models for students and their families.

Statistics

With advancements in early identification and technology, as well as increased awareness of CIs, the number of ISD students with CIs also continues to grow.
